The adoption by multinational groups of a proper tax risk control system is a prerequisite for a new approach to the taxpayer/revenue service relationship. Cooperative compliance ó to borrow the OECDøs wording ó improves a companyøs tax risk control because of the enhanced communication and cooperation between the taxpayer and the revenue service.

This is approach is much-debated by the Boards of major companies as it should bring significant benefits, especially in reputational terms, from the clear application of tax rules.

The correct understanding of this approach necessitates improved relationships built on the tax authorities changing how they operate as they have to give due consideration, in a relationship of mutual trust and cooperation with the taxpayer, to the business logic underlying the company& activities.

This international conference, promoted by the Courmayeur Mont Blanc and Centro nazionale di prevenzione e difesa sociale-CNPDS Foundations with the support of Ludovici Piccone & Partners, will take a holistic look at the tax risk management model given the Italian regulatory framework.

More generally, the question of certainty in tax law will be explored, along with assessing if this is fundamental to how States compete to attract companies. Time will also be spent examining the challenges, including organisational ones, of tax administration as part of aiding a country of development.
